

Nationally, 54% of women experience sexual violence compared to 46% of males<sup>3</sup>.



\*Intimate partner is a person with whom one has a close personal relationship which can be characterized by emotional connections, regular contact, ongoing physical contact and/or sexual behavior, identify as a couple or have knowledge and familiarity about each other's lives<sup>2</sup>.
