ICD-10-CM codes (2016 to 2017): Dx T42.4; a 5th/6th character of 1-unintentional; a 7th character of A-initial encounter, D-subsequent encounter, or missing.

ICD-9-CM codes (2008 to 2014): Ecode E853.2 (Accidental).

Notes: In 2016, a new data file structure was provided which included additional diagnosis code fields. It is unclear how this impacts trend data. Please interpret trends with caution.
