ICD-10-CM codes (2016 to 2017): Dx T42.6; a 5th/6th character of 1-unintentional; a 7th character of A-initial encounter, D-subsequent encounter, or missing.

ICD-9-CM codes (2008 to 2014): No equivalent ICD-9-CM codes.
